Faculty Position in Industrial Engineering

The Department of Mechanical and Industrial Engineering <http://www.mie.neu.edu> invites applications for a tenure-track/tenured faculty position in Industrial Engineering and Operations Research beginning in September 2010. Exceptional candidates at any level are encouraged to apply.

A Ph.D. in industrial engineering, operations research, or a related field is required. The successful candidate is expected to develop or continue a funded research program and excel in teaching in both our undergraduate and graduate programs. Any specialty area is of interest, but priority will be given to candidates with a strong methodological foundation in operations research and statistics and a demonstrated interest in healthcare.

Northeastern University is a national research university and world leader in cooperative education. The Mechanical and Industrial Engineering department includes roughly 30 nationally recognized faculty working in 14 funded research labs, and 4 research centers, with roughly \$8 million in annual research funding, including a \$3 million/year healthcare systems engineering center partnership with the VA healthcare system and 4 other universities.

Northeastern is located in downtown Boston within blocks of over a dozen of the top academic hospitals in the country, providing a rich environment for collaborative research. Among the many cultural attractions are the Museum of Fine Arts and Symphony Hall, both adjacent to the Northeastern campus.
